Antonello da Messina: Early Renaissance Oil Painter from Sicily

Antonello Messina is an Italian and Swiss painter, sculptor and musician. He was born in Palermo on July 24th, , and in January he became a citizen.

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Antonello da Messina, a Sicilian painter who became an important figure in Renaissance art is believed to have absorbed a method of oil painting pioneered by Jan van Eyck, achieving in the process a careful synthesis between the Italian and Northern Renaissance styles. It is a work first and foremost about space and light and only secondarily about the scholar-saint sitting in his well-carpentered library enclosure. Antonello visited Venice from to Venice and Northern Italy, – A. A different viewpoint, which has evolved recently, sees his apprenticeship to the painter Colantonio in Naples and his contact with Petrus Christus, a Flemish follower of Jan van Eyck, as the crucial factors in Antonello's early development. Shortly thereafter, Alfonso commissioned the rebuilding of the thirteenth-century Castelnuovo, a residential fortress in Naples. During his apprenticeship in the Naples of the Princes of Aragon – collectors

he completed a number of significant commissions and exchanged intellectual ideas with Giovanni Bellini ca.
